

Googaby Frequently Asked Questions

Is Googaby a sync agent or sync tool?

NO, Googaby is not a sync agent. Googaby does not claim to 'sync'.

Googaby can **push** changes in the Address Book to Google Contacts in the background.

This background push activity is one way from Address Book to Google Contacts.

The push does not require a sync step, it happens immediately when the Address Book changes. Googaby uses the Mac OS X notifications mechanisms. When Googaby receives notice of a an Address Book change, it determines whether the change (or changes) involve any of the records you have specified to be pushed. If so, Googaby passes those changes to Google in the background,

Here's Googaby viewpoint:

If you're a Mac user then the Address Book is where you should store your contact data. Not only are the data elements much richer than those of Google Contacts, but by storing your contacts in the Address Book, those contacts are available for all of the rest of the goodness that Apple brings to Mac OS X (today and tomorrow in Snow Leopard).

So relax, focus on Address Book. Just keep Address Book up to date and let Googaby take care of getting any changes you make sent up to your Google Contacts.

BTW: Only Googaby sends your contact pictures, group information, and custom labels.

If you do occasionally change or enter contacts on Google, then just open the Googaby browser and drag those Google changed contacts on top of the Address Book.
